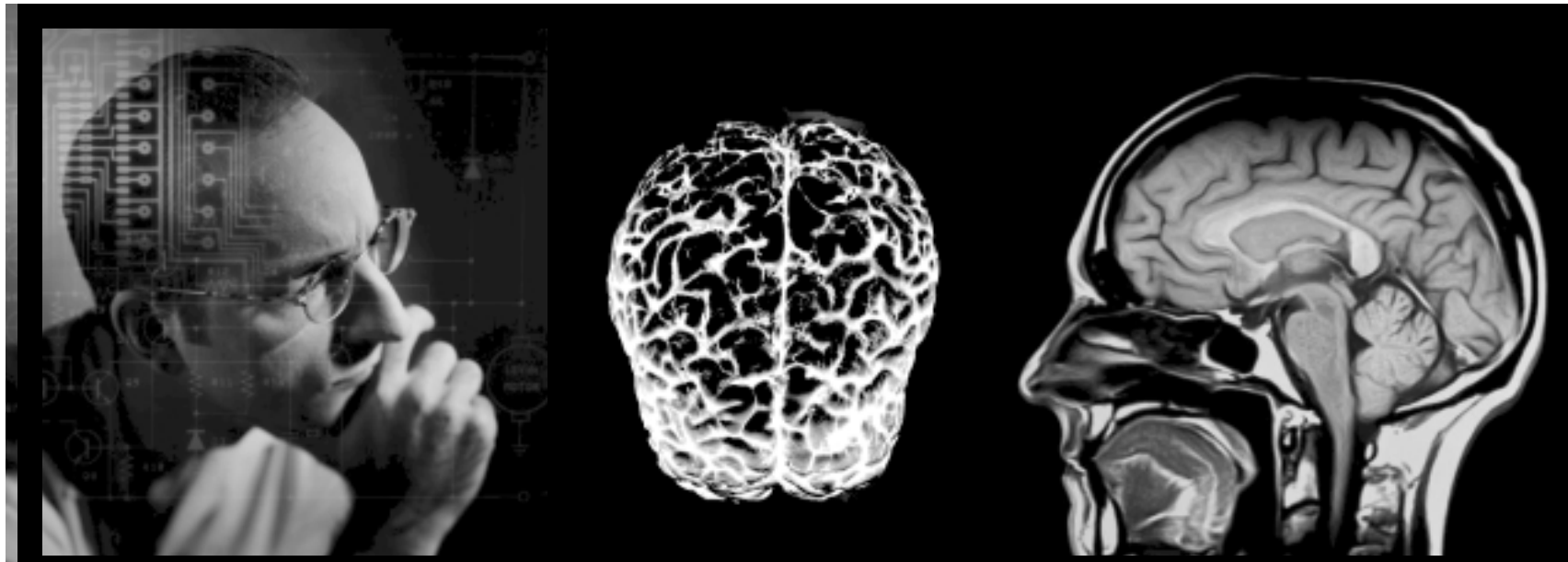


Call for Papers
